## 1. Values

As part of our school culture, we recognise and promote the following school values:

- ✓ Excellence [Hiranga] *For example: achievement, doing your best, perseverance, resilience, striving, competition.*
- ✓ Integrity [Ngakau] *For example: responsibility, accountability, reliability, commitment, honesty, truthfulness, trustworthiness, being ethical, doing right, moral courage.*
- ✓ Diversity [Rereketanga] *For example: respect for others and their views, beliefs and cultures, dialogue, tolerance, inclusion, cultural safety, wairua, spirituality.*
- ✓ Community and Engagement [Porihanga] *For example: community, belonging, civic-mindedness, connectedness, participation, family, whānau, peace, rangimārie, justice, negotiation, reconciliation, unity, solidarity, common good, Kotahitanga, citizenship, cooperation, hospitality.*
- ✓ Environment including Ecological Sustainability [Kaitiakitanga] *For example: environment, harmony with nature, conservation, guardianship, intergenerational equity.*

Each week there is a school focus on one of these values. These are also taught explicitly as part of the class programme. Students are recognised throughout the week if they display aspects of any of the values above. At the end of the week assembly one student from each class is acknowledged for displaying attributes of the focus value for the week. We also have a draw for a treat to recognise students.
