1. Values

As part of our school culture, we recognise and promote the following school values:

- ✓ Excellence [Hiranga] For example: achievement, doing your best, perseverance, resilience, striving, competition.
- ✓ Integrity [Ngakau] For example: responsibility, accountability, reliability, commitment, honesty, truthfulness, trustworthiness, being ethical, doing right, moral courage.
- ✓ Diversity [Rereketanga] For example: respect for others and their views, beliefs and cultures, dialogue, tolerance, inclusion, cultural safety, wairua, spirituality.
- ✓ Community and Engagement [Porihanga] For example: community, belonging, civic-mindedness, connectedness, participation, family, whānau, peace, rangimārie, justice, negotiation, reconciliation, unity, solidarity, common good, Kotahitanga, citizenship, cooperation, hospitality.
- ✓ Environment including Ecological Sustainability [Kaitiakitanga] For example: environment, harmony with nature, conservation, guardianship, intergenerational equity.

Each week there is a school focus on one of these values. These are also taught explicitly as part of the class programme. Students are recognised throughout the week if they display aspects of any of the values above. At the end of the week assembly one student from each class is acknowledged for displaying attributes of the focus value for the week. We also have a draw for a treat to recognise students.

6. Te Manawa Tahi Hub

You and your whanau can access services from the Ministry of Education & RTLB to ensure your tamariki and mokopuna are receiving the support they need when they are at their kura, kohunga reo, and early childhood Centre. Ministry representatives will be coming into our school to have a korero, face to face, 'kanohi ki te kanohi.' They will be here on Wednesday between 12-2pm to answer any of these questions for you. We invite all our whanau to come for a chat to 'mahi tahi,' work together to see how we can make things better for your tamariki and their education.

7. Swimming / Swimsafe Programme

We have a couple of important dates coming up for inter-school swimming.

- Zone Swimming Thursday 9th March
- Te Hiku School's Event Friday 17th March

We will be sending our top 3 students in each of the freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke races in the 8-11

year old age groups to the zone event. Those who are placed in the top 3 at the zone event qualify for the Te Hiku School's event.

Today we started a Swimsafe Programme. This will continue for the next 2 Mondays. Children are learning water entry, balance, buoyancy, breathing, water safety and survival skills that can be used for life. It's important that the students remember to bring along their togs for their swimming g days. Please ensure the students bring their togs and a towel in a strong watertight bag on their swimming days.
